



The following forms must be completed and returned no later than September 1st in order to complete the registration process. Registration will be voided if appropriate forms are not turned in. Forms are available online.

- Registration Form, Health Form/Parent Authorization Form, completed and signed
- Fieldtrip Form, completed and signed
- Birth Certificate (copy)
- Immunizations required (DPT, Polio, TB, MMR) Must be completed by your physician and turned in before the first day of school

In order to enroll your child in our program, you are required to assist in the classroom several times during the school year.

All participants must be 2, 3, or 4 years old on or by Sept 1.

Children with September birthdays (missed deadline) may petition the park district for placement in a class. Petitions will be considered after July 17th and only if there is space available. Placements will be taken in the order of receipt. Placement into a program that is not age appropriate does not guarantee placement in the following year's progressive program.

All children entering the 3 or 4 year old programs are expected to be potty trained and able to use the toilet independently to participate in class.

Before school year activities will be held the week prior to the first day of class.

Graduations will be held the week of May 8.

 A \$100 deposit is required at registration. Any departure from the program before August 1st will result in a \$50 processing fee
